AGGS is part of the Trafford Grammar Schools GL Consortium and will use exam papers in the entrance exam provided by GL. (Altrincham Grammar School for Boys, Altrincham Grammar School for Girls, Sale Grammar School, Stretford Grammar School and Urmston Grammar are known as The Trafford Grammar Schools GL Consortium).

In accordance with the Co-ordinated Admission Arrangements, all parents will be notified of the outcome of their application by their Local Authority on or about 1st March 2027 (National Offer Day).

### **Application and Admission Process**

Altrincham Grammar School for Boys, Altrincham Grammar School for Girls, Sale Grammar School, Stretford Grammar School, and Urmston Grammar are using the same entrance exam and consequently your child can only sit **one** exam and one centre.

#### **How to apply for a place at Altrincham Grammar School for Girls**

Please enter your child for the entrance exam by completing the online registration form available at:

You only need to register for the exam at one school within the Trafford Consortium, but you must state where you want your child to sit the exam and which of the Trafford Consortium Schools you wish to receive a total standardised result for. Scores cannot be retrospectively requested after the standardisation process has taken place. **Only girls can sit the examination at Altrincham Grammar School for Girls.**

Applications open at **12 noon on Thursday 23<sup>rd</sup> April 2026**, and close at **12 noon on Friday 19<sup>th</sup> June 2026**. Late applications cannot be considered until following the 1<sup>st</sup> March 2027.

Upon receipt of your application to sit the entrance exam, Applicaa will send you an email confirming that your child has been registered for the exam. This may take up to 48 hours to receive.

In the event our exam centre reaches its maximum capacity then ALL spaces will be reallocated by gender and distance; those living closest to the centre will be given priority.

You must also complete your Local Authority's Common Application Form (CAF). In Trafford, this must be submitted to them by **31<sup>st</sup> October 2026**. If you reside outside of Trafford, please check the return date specified by your Local Authority. If you wish your child to be considered for a place at this school, you must ensure that you have **named** Altrincham Grammar School for Girls as a preference when completing your Common Application Form.

By **Monday 7<sup>th</sup> September 2026**, you should have received the final details for the examination, which will include information advising arrival time and venue, along with the Special Circumstances Form and an Attendance Form which will be posted 1<sup>st</sup> class to the home address of all applicants. The applicant must bring the attendance form on the day of the exam complete with a photograph of your child attached. Failure to bring this form on the day will result in your child not being able to sit the exam on that day. You may use the **Special Circumstance Form** to record exceptional circumstances, which may have affected your child prior to the exam, or on the day of the exam itself. If you have not received this information **by Monday 7<sup>th</sup> September 2026**, please email [admissions@aggs.bright-futures.co.uk](mailto:admissions@aggs.bright-futures.co.uk) with your child's name, date of birth and address.

### **The Entrance Exam**

The entrance exam consists of two tests, each approximately one hour in length, containing questions that assess verbal, non-verbal and mathematics skills. For each element there will be a range of different types of questions.

Questions that test verbal ability skills may include questions relating to word choice, knowledge of words and their meanings and how words relate to each other; students may also be asked questions that relate to verbal reasoning comprehension skills.

Questions that test non-verbal ability skills may include questions relating to relationships between shapes and sequences of shapes, identification of common features from a set of figures and applying them to a new figure, codes and spatial awareness questions.

Questions that test mathematics skills generally cover content taught in schools up to the start of Year 6. The areas assessed typically include aspects of number, measurement, geometry and statistics. Some questions may involve using current mathematical skills to solve mathematic problems.

### **Malpractice in Exams**

Malpractice (cheating) in exams is taken very seriously. We are committed to making the examination process as fair as possible for all candidates. The entrance examination will be invigilated by a trained member of school staff and candidates will be made aware of the following rules at the start of each session:

- Do not take any electronic equipment into the test room, this includes mobile phones, earpods or watches of any description.
- Do not have any written material on your person once the examination begins, this includes notes of any type or any form of writing on your hands/arms etc.
- Do not look at any other test paper apart from your own, you must not turn around during the examination or attempt to look at anyone else's paper on any other desk.
- Do not talk to or distract any another candidate whilst under test conditions, this includes the use of gestures or the passing of notes.
- Do not continue writing once you have been told to put your pencils down.

If a candidate is found to be in breach of any of these rules, a member of staff will speak to the student individually to remind them of the rules. If a student persistently breaks these rules, they will be moved to an individual desk at the front of the examination room.

There will be a short break between the two tests for a toilet visit and/or a drink and light snack.

If your child does have to leave the room because of illness and subsequently goes home, please complete and return the Special Circumstances Form as soon as possible giving full details. We will then contact you.

### **Exam Results**

The exam scores will be standardised according to age, and we will let you know the outcome of the exam prior to **31<sup>st</sup> October 2026**, in time for you to complete your CAF. The qualifying score will be achieved by those candidates who score 334 and above in the exam.

Success in the entrance exam will not mean your child automatically receives a place at this School.

### **Oversubscription criteria and how places are awarded.**

Where **eligible** applications for admissions exceed the number of places available, and after students who have been successful in the exam and have a statement of SEN or an Educational Health and Care Plan, which names the school have been admitted, places will be awarded in accordance with the following order of priority:

- 1** Applicants who are 'Looked After'\* or who have been previously 'Looked After', regardless of their place of residence who have achieved a total standardised score of 324 and above;
- 2** Applicants residing within the school's catchment area\* who are in receipt of pupil premium\*, who have achieved a total standardised score of 324 and above;
- 3** Applicants residing within the school's catchment area who have a sister\* who will be a pupil of the school at the time of the applicant's proposed admission;
- 4** Applicants residing within the school's catchment area.\* Where the number of applicants qualifying for admission under this category exceeds the number of places available, then priority shall be given to those applicants residing closer to the school;
- 5** Applicants residing outside the school's catchment area\* who are in receipt of pupil premium\*, who have achieved a total standardised score of 324 and above. Where the number of applicants qualifying for admission under this category exceeds the number of places available, then priority shall be given to those applicants residing closer to the school;
- 6** Applicants residing outside the school's catchment area who have a sister\* who will be a pupil of the school at the time of the applicant's proposed admission. Where the number of applicants qualifying for admission under this category exceeds the number of places available, then priority shall be given to those applicants residing closer to the school;
- 7** Applicants residing outside the school's catchment area.\* Where the number of applicants qualifying for admission under this category exceeds the number of places available, then priority shall be given to those applicants residing closer to the school;

### **Admission of an applicant outside their normal age group**

Places will normally be offered in the year group according to the child's date of birth. However, consideration will be given to applications for admission outside their normal age group. If you would like to apply for admission of your daughter outside her normal age group, you should submit your request, alongside any supporting evidence, by 20<sup>th</sup> June 2026. Decisions will be made on an individual basis taking into account information regarding the applicant's academic, social and emotional development, in addition to factors detailed in Sections 2.17, 2.17A and 2.17B of the School Admissions Code (2021).

### **What happens after students have qualified and been offered a place?**

Following National Offer Day (1<sup>st</sup> March 2027), those who are offered a place here will receive further information relevant to the induction to our school.

## **Right of Appeal**

If your child is not offered a school place, you have the right of appeal. The School Governors arrange an independent panel, which will consider any appeals and details will be published on the school website by 28<sup>th</sup> February 2027 and available from the Admissions Officer after 1<sup>st</sup> March 2027.

## **Waiting List**

The school will operate a waiting list for Year 7 admission in September, following the completion of the allocation and appeals process. Qualified applicants will be ranked in accordance with our oversubscription criteria and the list will be maintained until 31<sup>st</sup> December 2027.

## **Frequently Asked Questions**

### **Are practice papers available?**

Practice papers are available on the GL website and on the consortium schools' websites.

### **How many questions/sections are there?**

There are two papers, each approximately one hour long, containing questions which assess verbal, non-verbal and mathematics skills. The number of questions and theoretical maximum mark information is not released to the school in advance.

### **How are the three skills combined?**

Information regarding examination scripts is confidential. All applicants have access to the familiarisation materials available via our website ensuring fair access to all. Examination content is confidential, to protect the integrity of the exam, and is supplied to school with a confidentiality provision – Altrincham Grammar School for Girls cannot disclose information about the exam.

### **Does the entrance exam take into account my child's age?**

Yes, the results are age standardised.

### **When will I know if my child has passed the exam?**

We will notify you prior to 31<sup>st</sup> October 2026 whether your child has been successful in the entrance exam. An email will be sent advising when you can access the result on Applicaa.

### **Is it possible for my child to pass the entrance exam for one school, but not the other?**

Yes. Although the entrance exam will be the same for each school, the standardised results may be different. This is because the exam results are being compared to those of a different cohort of children.

### **What if my child needs to go to the toilet or leave the room during the exam?**

No extra time is given if your child requires the toilet during the exam or needs to leave the room for any other reason. There will be a break between the two exams where your child will be able to use the toilet if required.

### **What if my child requires access arrangements?**

You must inform us at the point of application and **no later than 12noon on Friday 19<sup>th</sup> June 2026**, of any access arrangements your child may require during the entrance exam. Please provide supporting documentation for such requests with your application, including a letter from the Primary School confirming the normal way of working. We may contact your primary school in connection with the request. A panel, consisting of representatives from all five grammar schools, will meet after the closing date for registration to agree

appropriate access arrangements and parents/carers will be notified of the decision as soon as possible following the meeting.

### **What if my child is ill on the day?**

- If your child is ill immediately prior to or on the day of the test, **please do not bring her**. Please complete the Special Circumstances Form and return for the attention of the Admissions Officer. If you wish to inform us of any other special circumstances which may have affected your child prior to or on the day of the exam, please also submit a Special Circumstance Form. All forms to be received no later than **12 noon on Thursday 17<sup>th</sup> September 2026**.
- If your child leaves the exam room because of illness and subsequently goes home, and has started one of the test papers, she cannot return on another date and finish that particular paper. We can only let your child sit the paper she has missed. Please complete a Special Circumstances Form and return to us by **12 noon on Thursday 17<sup>th</sup> September 2026**.

### **Do I need to make AGGS the first preference on the Common Application Form (CAF)?**

If Altrincham Grammar School for Girls is your preferred school, you are strongly advised to place us as your first preference when completing your CAF. Should your child meet the admission criteria for more than one of your chosen schools, the Local Authority will allocate your child to the school of highest preference. If AGGS is not made first preference, your child may not receive the offer of a place even if she passes the entrance examination. For further advice on completing the CAF, please contact your Local Authority.

### **What is a looked after child?**

A looked after child is a child who is (a) in the care of a local authority, or (b) being provided with accommodation by a local authority, in the exercise of their social services functions (as defined in Section 22(1) of the Children Act 1989). Previously Looked After Children are children who were looked after but ceased to be so because they were adopted or became subject to a child arrangement order or special guardianship order. Section 14A of the Children Act 1989 defines a 'special guardianship order' as an order appointing one or more individuals to be a child's special guardian (or special guardians). This category includes children who have been in state care outside of England and ceased to be in state care as a result of being adopted. A child is regarded as having been in state care in a place outside of England if they were accommodated by a public authority, a religious organisation or any other provider of care whose sole purpose is to benefit society.

### **What is Pupil Premium?**

Pupil Premium is funding for publicly funded schools in England to raise the attainment of disadvantaged pupils. In addition to 'looked after children', schools receive pupil premium funding for pupils who were 'looked after' by an English or Welsh local authority before being adopted, or who left care on a special guardianship order or child arrangements order. Schools also receive funding for each child registered as eligible to free school meals at any point in the last six years.

### **What is Service Premium?**

The Service Premium is designed to support children with parents serving in the regular British armed forces.

Pupils attract the premium if they meet the following criteria:

- a) one of their parents is serving in the regular armed forces.
- b) one of their parents served in the regular armed forces in the last 3 years or one of their parents died while serving in the armed forces.
- c) the pupil is in receipt of a pension under the Armed Forces Compensation Scheme (AFCS) and the War Pensions Scheme (WPS)

**If the school is oversubscribed, what are the chances of my child being offered a place?**

This is dependent upon the number of qualified applicants within each group on the oversubscription criteria and the parental preference of those applicants when completing their CAF. **My child was successful in the entrance exam but not offered a place; can she be placed on the waiting list?**

**Please note – your child will not be automatically included on the waiting list.**

**Can I request a re-mark following the outcome from the entrance examination?**

No papers can be re-marked as all candidates must be treated equally.

The answer sheets are not held by the school, and we do not carry out manual remarks. We are fully confident in the reliability of the process and the accuracy of the scores provided by GL the service provider.

**Can I request a breakdown of scores?**

If your child has scored 334 or above, she will receive a 'PASS' from AGGS. Scores will be provided for those candidates who are not successful. A breakdown of the examination result will not be available.

**Home Address and Change of Home Address**

When you apply for the Entrance Exam you must use your child's permanent home address at the time of application. A child's **permanent** address (main residence) is the address where the child permanently lives now, or lives for the majority of the time. This cannot be a temporary address or one that you will be moving into soon.

You must inform the Consortium Schools of any change in permanent home address straight away. Please email the Admissions Team at each of the schools for which you have requested a result for your child to let them know any change of address. Please note that where an offer is made by Home Local Authorities on National Offer Day, further evidence of date of birth and permanent residency of the applicant and the parent/carer will be requested by a Consortium school in accordance with their own Admission Policy. Schools may withdraw the offer of a place if changes of address or circumstances have not been notified promptly to the school, or in the event that false, incorrect or misleading information has been provided to school where this has led to a place being offered or has advantaged the applicant in the priority order for oversubscription.

**In recent years, several places have been withdrawn after National Offer Day by Consortium Schools due to fraudulent or misleading address information used in the application process.**
